Council President - Opportunities to Serve & Engage

Every day is an opportunity to live out First Lutheran's new mission statement "God's Work. Our Hands. To Serve All People." but probably never more than in the month of September. There are so many opportunities to celebrate who we are as a church - freed in Christ to love and serve our neighbors. I'd like to highlight a few opportunities this month that First Lutheran is directly involved in.

The Social Justice Committee will march in the Southern Minnesota Pride Festival in Mankato on Saturday, **September 9th** in support of our LGBTQIA+ neighbors. All members are invited to join in this event. We will meet at 10:30 a.m.at the corner of Plum and Riverfront



streets in Mankato. The parade doesn't begin until 11:00 but we need to arrive early to get organized. The route is only 4 blocks long and we are done by noon. Not a huge time commitment but a huge way to show our commitment and solidarity to the LGBTQIA+ community.

For ten years the ELCA has designated a Sunday in September for a dedicated day of service known as "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday. To mark 10 years of "God's Work. Our Hands", we will be hosting several different service opportunities after worship on **Sunday, September 10th**. For those who are willing and able to do some yard work and light chores, we will travel to the Union Street Place. Union Street Place offers temporary shelter and low-income rental housing to people who are in need. Please wear work clothes and bring rakes, clippers, and other garden tools if you have them. We will also be assembling Refugee Services Donation Kits that Lutheran Social Services (LSS) will distribute to refugee families. This will take place in the church and won't require as much physical activity as the Union Street Place project. One more GWOH opportunity will be sponsored by the Greens committee. There will be supplies fill out a colorful ribbon with those elements of God's creation we endeavor to sustain and will discuss green activities. This would also be a great Sunday to invite a friend or neighbor to join us! What a wonderful way to engage others and widen the welcome to our neighbors.

The Kitchen serves a meal free of charge to anyone in the community on Monday evenings. The meal is hosted at Trinity Lutheran church and several area congregations take turns purchasing and putting together the meal. First Lutheran hosts the September meal on Monday the 25th. Preparation begins around 3:00 in the afternoon and help is needed at this time but also later when the meal is served at 5:30 and cleanup, which wraps up around 7:00. You can sign up to help in the Gathering Space at church.

These opportunities to love and serve our neighbors matter. They make a difference in the lives not only of those served but those who are able to serve. All involved will encounter God's love in amazing ways.





Scheduled for Sept. 10, this annual day of service is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) — one church, freed in Christ to love and serve our neighbor. Social Justice, the Greens and Nancy Thorkelson are coordinating this year's GWOH Sunday projects. These service projects will take place right after worship and include:

- **Union Place Shelter:** Yard work and other outdoor clean-up projects is being coordinated by the Social Justice Committee.
- **Indoor Activities at FLC:** Nancy Thorkelson and the Green Committee will have projects that will take place inside the church building that won't require as much physical activity.
- **Donations of Hygiene Products:** Please consider donating full sized hygiene products to add to LSS Refugee Kits. Donations of soap, shampoo, deodorant, razors, shaving cream, aftershave, lotion, tampons, pads, adult continence products, band aids, etc. can be dropped off at the church prior to September 10 or on that day.


