## Closing Report from Our 2022 Council President

Please remember the congregational meeting on December 4, immediately after worship (location is not yet determined). There is much that is important to discuss. The Finance Committee will submit for discussion a budget with more than a \$60,000 deficit. There are also elections for council and other offices, a vote on proposed by-law changes, and presentation of proposed changes to the constitution for a January vote. These are not yet on the website, but we hope to add them soon.

The past month has been a busy one at First. We celebrated Dedication Sunday (for which I was unfortunately out of town). We are most grateful to all of you who have submitted estimate of giving cards, no matter the amount. We have also seen the beginning of confirmation, Sunday School, and adult forums. We also had a successful—and warm—Trunk or Treat. Thanks to all who take part in these! And, as usual, thanks to all council members and committee chairs, worship assistants and ushers, the staff, and, of course, Pastor Chris. And, most of all, thanks to you for your presence at worship and support of our church.

I also preached on Reformation Sunday. Thanks to Pastor Ted Kunze for preaching on October 23.

We also signed a one-year agreement with Ecumen Pathstone to lease our basement for an adult day care facility.

I am glad that so many of you took the time to look at our displays of images and artifacts from the history of First Lutheran Church. They give us an idea of the varied and colorful history of our congregation, with everything from the fire to the tornado to First Lutheran Catholic Church to our new addition. They also gave those of us who were not here when the remodeling, many improvements, and additions to the church building were done; you can get an idea of what our mortgage is paying for! Thanks to David Fienen, our archivist, and Dave Pehrson, who knew where the “First Lutheran Catholic Church” sign was after David Fienen and I failed to find it!

I hope that you will prayerfully consider serving on a committee if you are not already on one. You can mark your interest in the Time and Talent form. There is a great deal of work done by the committees that is not always visible, or simply taken for granted. Serving on a committee is a time commitment, but it is also a great way to support the church, to get important work done, and get to know other members.

## Ecumen Pathstone Day Living is coming to First Lutheran!

Ecumen Pathstone Day Living is an Adult Day Service that has been serving individuals at the Mankato location since 1982. Their program was housed in Christ the King Church in Mankato for 20+ years until it moved onto the main Ecumen Pathstone Campus across from Sibley Park in 2021.


With our aging population's growing needs for healthcare services and a growing desire to live in their homes for as long as safely possible, Ecumen's Adult Day Service in Mankato has reached its capacity. Ecumen Pathstone Day Living has served many St Peter community members over the years, transporting 2-5 participants daily to their Mankato site. Transportation routes go out to some of St Peter's more rural neighbors including Kasota, Cleveland, and Le Center. All of this and the successful history of this program created an easy decision for Ecumen to expand their program and open an additional Adult Day Service in St Peter.

Adult Day Service is a unique program that serves individuals with a variety of diagnoses and needs. Most commonly the service is for individuals living with Dementia, Parkinsons, and developmental disabilities. The program can meet the physical, social, and medical needs of individuals. One of the more special aspects to Adult Day Services is how it serves the at home caregiver. Adult Day Services can provide much needed respite to those that are taking care of an ill parent or spouse. Self-Care is important and caregiver burnout is a real thing that no caregiver should feel ashamed of. Ecumen Pathstone Day Living, Adult Day Service will take care of your loved one in a safe environment while caregivers can have time to themselves.

Trained Adult Day Assistants can aid with activities of daily living, administer daily medications, and facilitate meaningful programming for the mind and the body. Ecumen Pathstone Day Living has daily exercise, adaptable games and activities, musical guests, intergenerational programming, field trips, and more.

Ecumen Pathstone Day Living is excited to bring their faith-based program back to a religious setting. Ecumen has provided a variety of quality healthcare services in our area for many years. Opening this additional program and partnering with First Lutheran will help both your congregation and Ecumen to serve the St Peter and neighboring community members. We are excited for this opportunity and hope to be operating out of this space by early 2023. We are grateful and thankful for this partnership.
