Christmas Candle Lighting Liturgy: What Can't Wait?

Voice A: This Advent, we have waited.

Voice B: We have waited for family to arrive.

Voice A: We have waited, singing, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

Voice B: We have waited for the casseroles to bake.

Voice A: We have waited for snow to fall.

Voice B: We have waited in department store lines.

Voice A: We have waited by fireplaces and around dinner tables.

Voice B: We have waited to raise our candles.

Voice A: We have waited to sing "Silent Night."

Voice B: We have waited for the magic of this day.

Voice A: And now the wait is over. It is Christmas, which means God is here and you are loved.

Voice B: May that truth change you. May it inspire you, challenge you, and burn in you like the light from these candles.

Voice A: For today we light the candles of hope, peace, love, and joy to remind us of our journey to this space. And to those lights we add the Christ candle, for the wait is over.

Voice B: Love is here. Thanks be to God. Amen.

All five candles are lit while stanza 1 of "Go Tell It on the Mountain" (hymn no. 290) is sung:

**Go tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere;
go tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born!

A Reading from the book of Isaiah — Isaiah 52:7-10

How beautiful upon the mountains

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. He is the reflection of God’s glory and the exact imprint of God’s very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

***Gospel — John 1:1-14**

The Gospel of John, the 1st chapter.

Glory to you, O Lord.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father’s only son, full of grace and truth.
